

Summit unveils Phase II of Building Hope Capital Campaign

Last month, The Summit Center unveiled Phase II of its Building Hope Capital Campaign which will support the Center for Autism Assessment and Treatment at 165 Creekside Drive, Amherst, NY. This integrated school and treatment model does not exist anywhere else in New York State.

Phase I of the Campaign included the completion of Summit's Behavioral Pediatrics Clinic, Children's Guild Foundation Pediatric Feeding Clinic, and the conference and training center at 75 Pineview Drive in Amherst, NY.



On September 16, Summit CEO Stephen R. Anderson, Ph.D., gave a presentation on the Center for Autism Assessment and Treatment and the tremendous impact it will have on our community.

"The Summit Center's Building Hope Campaign has changed the landscape for individuals with autism. In Phase 2, Summit will provide an intensive treatment program for families right here in Western New York," said Dr. Anderson.

Currently, parents who have a child with autism in crisis must make the difficult decision to send their son or daughter to a treatment center out-of-state. 
Our Academy A.P.E. Department has uploaded several fitness, yoga, dance, and music movement videos for our students to follow from home.


Summit Academy Students are Happy to be Back!
